Starbird-Devlin Car Show Raises \$75,000 for Wichita Charities

Overhauled show attracts thousands for family fun and a good cause

Wichita, Kan. – In its first year as a 501(c)(3) organization, the 55th Annual Starbird-Devlin Rod & Customs Charities Car Show, held in January at Century II, raised more than \$75,000. Proceeds from the show were distributed among three Wichita charities – Starkey, Inc., The Arc of Sedgwick County and the Wichita Children's Home – each receiving \$25,000.

"This car show is a longtime tradition in Wichita, and so are these charities," said Tim Devlin, board president, Cars for Charities and owner of Devlin Rod and Custom. "The staff and countless volunteers of these charities are driving our community forward. With this donation, we hope they can get there a little faster so they can accomplish even more great work for Wichitans in need."

The newly revamped show represents a love for cars and a love for our community, as it's the first year all proceeds were given to area nonprofits. The donation was made possible because of the support from the Wichita-area community.
